### INTERNET


This is the most up-to-date medium available. The Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) issues a range of warnings specific to boating:

Warning	Speed
Small Craft Wind Alert	> 20 knots
Strong Wind Warning	25-33 knots
Gale Warning	34-47 knots
Storm Warning	> 47 knots

Wind gusts may be 40% stronger.

# SAFETY EQUIPMENT

#### LIFE JACKETS (PFDS)

It is compulsory to wear an approved life jacket (PFD) in any recreational motor boat or motor-propelled tender that is under six (6) metres in length, when under power.

Children under the age of 12 years must wear a life jacket in recreational motor boats and motor-propelled tenders of any length, when under power.

#### Personal Flotation Device – Level 150 or Level 100 (Required for Sheltered Waters)

A Level 150 or 100 must comply with the Australian Standard AS 4758.

#### Personal Flotation Device – Level 50 (Smooth Water Only)

A Level 50 must comply with Australian Standard AS4758.

#### Inflatable PFDs Need to be Serviced

Inflatable PFDs should be serviced according to the manufacturer's recommendations and also self-tested in between to ensure efficiency.

### COLD WATER IMMERSION

- Water temperature in Tasmania rarely gets above 20°C.
- The risk of drowning increases nearly five times if the water temperature is below 15°C.
- All research points to the fact that by wearing a life jacket, your chances of survival are far greater.

Water Temperature Celcius°	Loss of Dexterity with no protective clothing	Exhaustion or unconsciousness	Expected time of survival
0.3-4.5	< 3 mins	15-30 mins	30-90 mins
4.5-10.0	< 5 mins	30-60 mins	1-3 hours
10.0-15.5	10-15 mins	1-2 hours	1-6 hours
15.5-21.0	30-40 mins	2-7 hours	2-40 hours
21.0-26.5	1-2 hours	2-12 hours	3 hours - indefinte
